- **Cautionary:**

It is written to indicate the negative impact of the topic on the reader. It can be taken as if teenagers are asked to avoid many things that deviate them from the right path. This anecdote is used to address caution and its adverse effects or seek a [paper writing service](#).

- **Philosophical:**
